We are pleased to announce the details of AccountAid’s annual workshop for grant-makers and CSR managers. Similar workshops have been held a number of times since 1999. This year’s workshop is being organized at Delhi in collaboration with **CRY – Child Rights & You.**

Design & contents: Rapid changes in NGO regulation and operating environment have left many grant-making agencies wondering about sustainability of their programs. This workshop is intended to help donors understand these changes and find alternative ways of collaboration. The workshop is designed as a series of interactive presentations, followed by group discussion and exercises. The key facilitator will be Shri Sanjay Agarwal, FCA.

About CRY

CRY – Child Rights and You is an organisation determined to bring about lasting change in the lives of underprivileged children in India, through the power of collective action. CRY's 38-year journey (1979-2017), has had a single purpose - ensuring a happy, healthy and creative child whose rights are protected and honoured in a society that is built on respect for dignity, justice and equity for all. In the process, CRY has learned that the only sustainable way to make change last is to adopt the 'child rights approach.'

CRY prioritizes grant-making based on child rights indicators and identifies grassroots NGOs and communities addressing the key issues. Since financial risk is inherent in any grant-making decision, the challenge lies in bringing it down to a manageable level, so that it does not impact the program or the funder's goals at partner level.

CRY's founder, Mr. Rippan Kapur, was known to have been intolerant to the misuse of CRY funds, even if it was an inconsequential amount. Thus CRY has had the highest level of regard to the need for financial accountability and transparency of funds. Within CRY, financial risk management (FRM) systems have been firmly in place for the last twenty years now, thanks to the collective efforts of AccountAid and the CRY teams. In this effort, CRY has conducted financial reviews of more than 500 partners. It has helped many grass root level organisations develop their control systems and become financially strong and statutorily compliant.

ABOUT ACCOUNTAID

AccountAid (now incorporated as AccountAid Consulting Pvt. Ltd. (CIN:U93000DL2013PTC253938)) is a private consulting organisation, which was set up in 1992. Its focus is on accounting, accountability and regulation of organised giving. It works with four key stakeholders: Grant-makers, Implementing NGOs, Auditors and Government regulators.¹ It conducts research, training workshops and publishes several short newsletters, such as, *AccountAble*, *AccountAble Asia*, *AuditAble*, *Lekha Yog* and *GrantAble*.

It has worked closely with grant-makers in organizations such as Ford Foundation, CRY, Oxfam America, Charities Aid Foundation, MSDF and other agencies for providing support on pre-funding and post-funding financial assessment, capacity-building of grantees, systems building in grant-making organizations, and training grant-makers on financial management of grants.

AccountAid has a small team of five persons with diverse professional skills such as education, business administration, analysis and interpretation. It draws on experience of practicing Chartered Accountants and other professional associates, as required. AccountAid has sent key resource persons to over a hundred workshops organized by various agencies including Actionaid, Asia Foundation – Beijing, Cairn India, CAPART, CARE, Charities Aid Foundation, ChristianAid – Bangladesh, CRS, CRY, Diakonia, EZE, Ford Foundation, Godrej Industries, HelpAge India, Intercoperation – Bangladesh, Oxfam America, Oxfam India Trust, Oak Foundation - Geneva, Swissaid, SOIR-IM, WaterAid, as also various network groups.
